

Donors make a difference

First West Team members **empower change every payday** through First West Foundation's payroll giving program. Donating **\$89,635.09** in 2024, donors gave generously to the Foundation's community and named endowments; First West Credit Union's Signature Cause partner food banks with Feed the Valley and The Full Cupboard; and our community partner agencies, BC Children's Hospital Foundation and BC Cancer Foundation.

Donors are also connecting with the Foundation in new ways, helping us review and select grantees through our **SOAR Committee**, the **Envision Financial Employees' Endowment Committee** and our newest, the **Nourish Well Committee**. Welcoming donors and deepening our relationships with them is an amazing opportunity. We're increasing collaboration and at the same, raising awareness about charities leading in our communities.

As a contributing partner in community, aligning with these goals allows the Foundation to **increase its efforts**, have flexibility to grow its presence in identified areas, and **focus its impact**.



\$45,000 was disbursed to **4 organizations** focused on building individual resiliency and **reducing poverty** in communities across BC.



Increasing access to nutritious and culturally appropriate food and reducing **food insecurity** through **9 grants** totaling **\$160,000**.



Increasing a **sense of wellbeing** and access to mental health counselling and services, **\$318,700** supported **27 organizations.**



\$70,500 was granted to advance education programs and services at **8 organizations**.

Trust-based philanthropy guides our grantmaking. In 2024, **\$823,494** to **59 organizations** was released through our regional community endowments.



Our impact through the lens of the SDGs

Empowering financial wellbeing

For participants of Launch Okanagan's financial education programs, one-on-one coaching and the innovative Matched Savings Program help make dreams a reality. Focused on improving **financial confidence**, knowledge, and skills among people facing barriers such as low income, high debt, low credit scores, and low assets, the Matched Savings Program provides a 3:1 return (up to \$1,800) for participants who complete the 12-month program. **Grants are committed to life-enhancing goals** like education, a child's RESP, tools for trade workers, or starting a small business. In 2024, Launch helped **over 900** individuals gain control of their financial lives through its 46 programs and **3,405 financial education hours**.

Cultivating community through local food

Serving our community since 2012, the **Okanagan Fruit Tree Project Society** has harvested an amazing 475,417 pounds of produce, increasing access to fresh fruit and vegetables to more **than 100 schools and social service agencies** across the Central and South Okanagan each year.

Until recently, harvests were food rescue missions working with local families, orchards and farmers. In 2021, they received a gift of a 36 acre working farm in East Kelowna. This one-of-a-kind opportunity was the right fit for a **Keeping a Good Thing Growing** grant. The Foundation's newest endowment, established by First West Credit Union in 2022, focuses on initiatives that enhance an organization's ability to grow its capacity, programs, or services. **A grant of \$17,298** was the final instalment needed by the Society for its new irrigation system. Careful planning is underway to begin growing the vision of a community farming program.





Breaking stigma barriers to better mental health



Stigma-Free Society's Rural Mental Wellness Program, delivered in Abbotsford, Chilliwack and Kitimat, supports people in farming communities and small towns across B.C. To reduce barriers to talking about one's mental health, Stigma-Free created a toolkit, an online resource which includes peer supported videos, articles and activities designed to encourage open discussion.

In 2024, 9,000 rural residents accessed the **Rural Mental Wellness Toolkit**, an increase of **more than 53%** over 2023. A \$15,000 grant from the Envision Financial Community Endowment helped Stigma-Free expand the Toolkit, amplifying more impact, fostering empathy and support for those struggling with their mental health.

Inspiring lifelong learning

The **Literacy Alliance of the Shuswap Society** is dedicated to ensuring local children improve their reading ability and foster a love of reading in a supportive, relevant, and inclusive learning environment. The **Summer Slide Reading Program** provides additional literacy support and educational opportunities to students who have completed grades 1 to 3. Summer literacy programs address the annual phenomenon of children losing their academic skills over the summer break. Each year, **100 students participate** in the program.

Celebrating Black history



The **BC Black History Awareness Society** works to promote understanding, diversity and inclusion by engaging the whole community on Black contributions to culture, government, sports, and the well-being of society.

Encouraging youth and children to celebrate Black history, was an initiative to expand the scope of the work by facilitating getting free copies of **BC Black History Timeline**, with **128 stories spanning 190 years of Black achievement** and overcoming barriers, into the hands of teachers.

Growing from the inside out

Established in 2015 by First West Credit Union, the **Leaders Fund** focuses on supporting initiatives that **advance capacity building** and development opportunities, including supporting community efforts, education and professional training for leaders and volunteers serving our local charities. Investing in an organization's sustainability is always a good thing. Whether its enhancing board governance, volunteer training, or improving infrastructure and systems to advance service delivery, **these grants have a big impact.**

Our community partners

First West Foundation is a federally registered charity and is classified as a private foundation affiliated with First West Credit Union. It was created by the Board and Executive in 1996 to be a perpetual source of funding in support of communities served by First West Credit Union. The Foundation, with assets over \$21.4 million, uses income generated from its 18 endowments to help our communities thrive.

Granting is the cornerstone of the Foundation's community work, and we continue to evolve our processes through the lens of trust-based philanthropy. Since 1996, the First West Foundation has donated more than \$12.6 million in grants to local community groups and projects. The Foundation grows its endowments through charitable gifts and bequests.

We are proud to invest in the operational needs of our charitable partners with our Impact Grants--unrestricted funds to support their administrative costs, programs and services. Our Capacity Grants--restricted funds-- invest in an organization's pursuit of education, professional development, training, governance and infrastructure enhancement.
